The International Society of Doctors for the Environment (ISDE), hav-ing a recognized role of advocacy for health and environment worldwide, is alarmed for the news on the ongoing transatlantic agree-ments known as TTIP.

If the foretaste were confirmed, and the treaties announced were ac-tually signed by the EU Parliament and the Governments of North Amer-ican Coun-tries, despite the widespread opposition of the involved populations, the preconditions are looming for an unprecedented dis-aster, at environ-mental, so-cial and health care level.

From an environmental standpoint, with such agreements many rules would be weakened or threatened to be dismantled, which currently aim to pro-tect people from the pollution stemming from the pro-duction and con-sumption of many industrial products, including espe-cially food products.

From the health standpoint, the implementation of those agree-ments would further increase the exposure of populations affected by pollu-tion; thus, in the long run, morbidity and mortality rates of those illnesses in-creasingly recognized as related to pollution would rise.

From a social standpoint, the approval of those agreements would be a serious blow to democratic decision-making processes, which require trans-parency and par-ticipation, as well as to the sover-eighty of both the EU member states and the North Amer-ican Countries.

Therefore, ISDE strongly appeals to the European Parlia-ment to stop imme-diately those negotiations with the Governments of Transatlantic Countries and to ultimately drop them, and to reject any further attempt of future lobbying in this area.

ISDE also asks the European Parliament to improve and strengthen the ex-isting rules and regulations in this area, and make them more strict, rather than worse..
